ADMISSION

Procedure for Admission

The prospectus and application forms are available in the College Office on remittance of the following fees :

Aided Courses

UG Courses Rs. 50

PG Courses Rs. 60

Applications for admissions should be submitted to the Principal within 10 working days after the receipt of Mark Sheets of their qualifying examination. Late applications will be taken into consideration after giving priority to those received in time.

Applications with insufficient or incomplete particulars will not be considered. The application form should be returned duly filled in along with three attested photo copies of the Mark Sheet of the qualifying examination passed. Transfer Certificate, Community Certificate and five passport size colour photos.

Eligibility for Admission :

UG Courses - A Pass in Higher Secondary or an equivalent examination* recognised by the Bharathiar University, Coimbatore. Admission is subject to verification of Mark Sheet & Certificates issued by the Director of Government Examinations and if the Mark Sheet is found to be bogus, admission will be denied.

The upper age limit for admission to the UG courses will be 21 Years as on 1st July 2017. For SC/ST/MBC/DNC/BC and women candidates, the age limit is relaxed by 3 years. A relaxation of 5 years is permitted for differently abled candidates.

PG Courses - A candidate who has passed the Degree Examination as main subject of study of any University accepted by the syndicate of the Bharathiar University, Coimbatore or as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to the PG Courses.

Reservation and Selection Procedure

Admission will be made on the basis of merit, subject to the reservation rules of the Government of Tamil Nadu i.e. 31% for Open competition; 30% for Backward classes; 20% for Most Backward classes and Denotified communities; 18% for Scheduled Castes and 1% for Scheduled Tribes for each subject.

Out of the above quota, 3% seats are reserved for physically challenged candidates belonging to each category separately.

6 seats in UG courses and 2 seats in PG courses shall be reserved for the children of Ex-Servicemen of Tamil Nadu origin.

As per Tamil nadu Government reservation rules, 3% of seats in UG Courses and 2% of seats in PG Courses are reserved under sports quota for students who have represented at the District/State / National level with due submission of certificates.

Selection For Admission

Merit List for all the UG programmes (except B.A. Eng. Lit.) will be prepared on the basis of Marks obtained in the individual subjects under Part III of the Qualifying Examinations for a total of 800 Marks. For B.A., English Literature the merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks secured in Part II English.

Applications of eligible candidates are processed and the merit list and the selection list for all the departments are prepared. Information regarding the admission date, selection list and the waiting list are displayed in the notice board and the interview card is sent to the selected candidates. The selected candidates are interviewed and their certificates are verified by the admission committee. **All admissions made are provisional, subject to the approval of Bharathiar University.** The college has the right to cancel the admission on a later date, if any of the documents is found to be false or if the qualification of the candidate admitted is not approved by Bharathiar University, Coimbatore.

Students are advised to take sufficient number of photocopies of their original certificates before submitting them to the college.

- ✧ No notices are to be circulated among the students or posted on the notice board by anybody without the permission of the Principal.
- ✧ Visitors are not allowed during the working hours of the college.
- ✧ Day students should not undertake any transaction like purchasing, posting or lending things etc., for hostel students.
- ✧ The college will not receive any letters or other postal transactions for the day students.
- ✧ Parents and guardians must notify change of address immediately.
- ✧ **Use of cameras and cell phones inside the campus is strictly prohibited. If found guilty, disciplinary action will be taken.**
- ✧ The cleanliness of the college buildings and surroundings is the personal responsibility of every student. Sticking of papers, writing on the walls, plucking flowers from the plants in the garden are not permitted.
- ✧ A student may be dismissed by the Principal for continued absence or serious misconduct. In that case if she is a stipendiary, she shall be required to refund the whole amount drawn by her from the State funds.
- ✧ The Principal's decision shall be final in matters of punishment of the student for the violation of the rules of the college.
- ✧ The students will be issued conduct certificate only after fulfilling the above stipulated rules and regulations and as per the recommendation of the Head of the Department.
- ✧ The students should be attentive in gathering the information, updated through the Public Address System/College website (www.vcw.ac.in)

Ward Counselling System

A group of about 20 students will be assigned to each member of the staff who will be designated as their counsellor. The counsellor will be available for consultation and advice on academic and personal matters. Counselling will be done on last Thursday of every month between 2.45 p.m. and 3.45 p.m.

Attendance and Leave of Absence

No student will be allowed to absent herself from the college without leave letter. She must apply beforehand for leave of absence through the Head of the Department in the prescribed form. When absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for

leave must be submitted as early as possible and in no case later than the first day of her return to the college.

Absence without submitting the leave letters at the beginning and end of the semester and before and after a college holiday will entail fines.

A minimum attendance of 75% out of total working days of the college is necessary **to be eligible to appear for** the End Semester Examinations. A minimum attendance of 90% out of total working days is necessary to receive scholarships.

Regulations for UG & PG Programmes under Autonomy

Vellalar College for Women, became autonomous from the academic year 2007-2008 and continues to be affiliated to Bharathiar University, Coimbatore. The college has introduced Choice Based Credit System from the academic year 2008-09. Following are the regulations:

1. Duration of the Courses

UG - 3 years; PG - 2 years; MCA - 3 years. An academic year covers two semesters with not less than 90 working days each and examinations are conducted at the end of every semester.

2. Course of Study

The course of study for the UG degrees of all branches shall consist of the following:

a) Part - I : Tamil / Hindi

The language paper shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination at the end of each semester. For para-professional courses (B.B.A., B.Sc., (CS), B.Sc., (CT), B.Sc., (IT), B.C.A., B.Sc., Maths (CA) & all streams of B.Com.,) it shall be offered for the first two semesters with one examination at the end of each semester.

b) Part - II : English

English shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination at the end of each semester. For para-professional courses, it shall be offered for the first two semesters with one examination at the end of each semester.

3. Attendance requirement to appear for the End Semester Examination [UG & PG]

A candidate will be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examinations provided she has a minimum of 75% attendance.

If her attendance is between 65% and 74%, she will have to apply for condonation of the shortage of attendance. However, the Principal may condone the lack of attendance of those candidates on certain ground -Medical grounds, Major calamity, Accident which demands a long rest and permit them to write the End Semester Examination after payment of a prescribed fee.

If a candidate does not fulfil the limit prescribed for condonation of attendance, she will not be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examination.

Those candidates, who could not write the End Semester Examination in any semester can continue their studies in the subsequent semester.

However, the candidate with less than 50% of attendance in any semester will not be allowed to continue her study in the subsequent semester and she will be permitted to re-join the semester in which the attendance is less than 50% and continue the course.

Deficiency of the attendance in one semester shall be compensated in the subsequent semester such that the combined attendance of those two semesters will be taken into account for determining the eligibility of a candidate to be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examination.

A candidate will be given only one opportunity to carry forward the deficiency in attendance of one semester during the degree course, failing which she has to re-do the course with the permission of the University.

4. Restrictions to appear for the Examinations[UG &PG]

- ✧ Any candidate having arrear papers shall have the option to appear for the arrear paper along with the regular semester papers.
- ✧ UG candidates who fail in any of the papers in Part I shall complete the paper in 3 successive attempts in the same syllabus including the first attempt. Candidates who fail in any of the papers in Part II, Part III and Part IV shall complete the paper in the same syllabus in 6 successive attempts including the first attempt.
- ✧ MCA candidates who fail in any of the papers shall complete the paper in the same syllabus in 6 successive attempts (4 attempts for lateral entry) including the first attempt.
- ✧ All other PG candidates who fail in any of the papers shall complete the paper in the same syllabus in 4 successive attempts including the first attempt.
- ✧ If they fail to do so in the above cases, they shall take the examination in the syllabus in vogue at that time of their subsequent attempts.
- ✧ In case of non-existence of the paper, they shall appear for an equivalent paper in the revised syllabus

5. Medium of Instruction and Examinations

The medium of instruction and examinations is English.

6. Submission of Record Note Books

Candidates should submit bonafide Record Note Books for practical examinations.

7. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA)

For computation of CIA marks, the components considered are :

(i) tests (ii) seminar / assignment / debate (iii) model examination.

8. Passing Minimum

- ✧ The minimum mark to obtain a pass in UG Programme is 40% in the end semester examination and 40% in the aggregate of CIA+ESE.
- ✧ The minimum mark to obtain a pass in PG Programme is 50% in ESE and 50% in the aggregate of CIA+ESE.

9. Provision for improvement of marks (Theory Papers)

- ✧ A candidate who obtains a pass mark in a paper in the first attempt can reappear for the same paper in the immediate succeeding ESE, for improving her marks.
- ✧ The improved marks will be considered for classification and not for ranking.

10. Re-do Candidates

Candidates of this college who discontinued the course due to lack of attendance / any other reasons will be readmitted in the same course, subject to the conditions of vacancy, after obtaining permission from the Bharathiar University.

11. Transfer Candidates

Candidates who want to join this college by transfer from other regular college recognised by Bharathiar University / other Universities will be admitted in the same course, subject to the conditions of vacancy, after obtaining permission from Bharathiar University. Migration and Eligibility certificates are required for the students who belong to other Universities / other States.

12. System of Transparency

Improvement/retotaling/revaluation/obtaining photocopy of valued answer scripts is permissible only for the current semester papers and not for any arrear paper. The candidate has to apply to the Controller of Examinations through the Principal, in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed fee within 7 working days from the date of publication of results in the college web site. [For further details, visit the college website www.vcw.ac.in]

13. Issue of Certificates and Mark Sheets

The Certificates and Mark Sheets will be issued after the publication of the results with a note of the due date to receive the same.

The students on receiving Certificates and Mark Sheets must verify them for correctness of Name, Reg.No., Course, etc. and must contact the Controller of Examinations immediately, if any discrepancy is found.

For getting Duplicate Mark Sheets an affidavit and FIR copy from the nearest police station must be submitted through Principal along with the fee prescribed.

14. Provision for Supplementary Examinations

Supplementary examinations are conducted in the even semester for the final year (UG & PG) students of all disciplines (i.e. end of the course period).

Candidates who fail in only one paper in the final semester will be permitted to take up supplementary examinations.

Candidates who wish to appear for supplementary examinations can apply to the Controller of Examinations through the Principal, in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed fee within 7 working days from the date of publication of the revaluation results.

15. Classification of Successful Candidates - UG & PG

A candidate who passes all the examinations in the first attempt within the prescribed period securing 75% and above marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have passed the Degree in **First Class with Distinction**. Successful candidates passing the Degree Examinations, securing 60% marks and above shall be declared to have passed the degree in **First Class** and candidates securing 50% - 59% shall be declared to have passed the examination in **Second Class**.

Medical Examination

All the 1 year UG students will be medically examined by a qualified doctor soon after their admission in the college. The report of the medical examination will be sent to the Bharathiar University, Coimbatore.

ID Card

Identity cards issued to the students are valid for the entire course. This card should be produced by the student on demand at any time. If the ID card is lost, a fine of Rs.50/- will be collected for issuing a duplicate ID card.

Co-operative Store

The staff and students are the members of Vellalar College for Women Staff and Students Co-operative Stores Limited. Text books are available in the co-operative store at 5% - 15% discount and all stationery items are sold at a relatively cheaper rate.

LIBRARY

The Library, the largest block in the ground floor is very spacious and measures 640 sq.m. with adequate reading facilities for 200 students at a time. It has an excellent collection of books and journals, both Indian and foreign to meet the demands of students upto research level. The library is equipped with bar-code technology for computerised circulation system since 2000. The digital library has 18 computer systems with internet and printing facilities.

Library Rules

- ✧ The staff and students are members of the college library.
- ✧ The library will be kept open on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.
- ✧ All categories of users have a bar coded identity card.
- ✧ Library books will be issued only on presentation of the library cards. Reference books and journals will not be lent out. In case the card is lost, the librarian must be informed of the loss immediately in writing. A duplicate card may be issued on payment of Rs. 25/-.
- ✧ Each UG student can borrow only two books at a time and each PG student / Research Scholar can borrow four books at a time.
- ✧ Members shall retain the books for fifteen days from the date of issue. However, the librarian reserves the right to recall the books any time.
- ✧ If a book is not returned on the due date or when recalled, a fine of Re.1/- per day will be levied.
- ✧ All books must be returned to the library four days before the closure of each semester.
- ✧ In case, a borrowed book is lost it will be replaced by the user or double the cost of the book will be collected from the defaulter with other charges, if any.
- ✧ Strict silence must be observed in the library.

Book Bank

The Book Bank provides text books to the poor and deserving students every semester. The students are allowed to keep the books for one semester.

Scholarship

Students belonging to the BC, MBC, SC & ST are eligible for scholarship from the Government of India or from the Tamilnadu Government.

Students applying for scholarship should submit the following certificates in original: Community Certificate, Income Certificate and Statement of Marks.

The following scholarships and concessions are available as per Government guidelines:

Students who receive the Scholarship should satisfy the stipulation of 90% of attendance.

All scholarships are liable for forfeiture for misconduct, irregularity in attendance, unsatisfactory progress in studies, indiscipline, indulging in illicit drugs & drinks consumption etc.
