- (c) The institution encourages faculty participation in Research by motivating the faculty members to pursue research on part-time basis. Faculty members are motivated to present papers in International, National Seminars and Conferences by making use of UGC grants and also motivated to participate in International Conferences abroad. The faculty members have benefited by the unstinted support offered by the institution and have displayed their expertise and research acumen in an exemplary

- d. Community Development Programmes have been carried out on a regular and continuous basis for the upliftment of the downtrodden and underprivileged sections of the society. As many as 50 programmes were executed by service units such as NSS, YRC, RRC, Enviro-Club, Bio-health Club, Women Cell, EDP Cell, Citizen Consumer Club, Quiz Club, Audio visual and Photography Club and "Velichangal" Forum.

# e. Training Programmes for the teaching & non-teaching staff and the students.

#### Yoga and Meditation

Students of the I year UG classes were introduced to a week-long Yoga & Meditation classes to enable them to develop concentration and self-confidence. They were exposed to various yoga practices to destress the mind and develop physical fitness and mental alertness.

A course on ethics is important as it provides a way to measure one's ethical nature in some form by formalizing many ideas, it is made as one of the foundation courses. A paper on Environment is made compulsory with an aim that an awareness and knowledge of the environmental issues would make them contribute to the environmental protection, a social cause.

#### **Faculty Development Programmes**

Under the auspices of the IQAC, a special meeting on 'Re-search on Research Proposals for Funding' was organized on 22.09.2012, with **Dr.B.Vanitha**, Associate Professor of Economics, Bharathiar University, as the Resource Person. IQAC organized a UGC funded faculty development programme - a One-day workshop on 'Internet Banking' on 08.12.2012 with the personnel of Bank of Baroda, Thindal Branch, **Mr.G.Arivithiran**, Assistant Manager and **Ms.Krithiga**, Staff, as the Resource Persons. The Cell organized a faculty development workshop on 'National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL)' conducted by **Mr.Godfrey Rajan**, Lead, Classle, Chennai, on 08.01.2013. The objective of the programme was to familiarize the members of the staff and the research scholars with the assorted range of teaching / learning possibilities offered by Classle.
